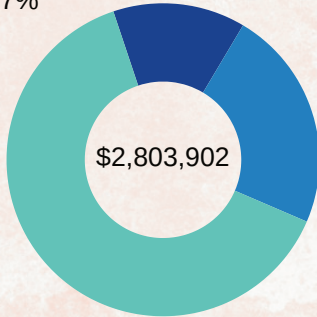

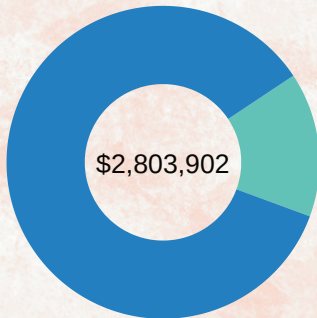

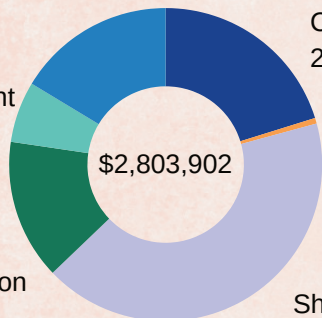

OHRA is a human services hub, helping individuals and families in Jackson County to remove barriers and achieve stability.

Whether someone visits Jackson County's only walk-in **Resource Center**, is a guest at our six-month low-barrier **Shelter**, or uses the **Laundry/Shower Trailer**, a resource navigator is there. Dignity, respect, and hope are there too.

Walk-in Resource Center

OHRA's Resource Center is where our neighbors, housed or unhoused, find hope and help. Anyone in need can walk in the door and meet with a resource navigator. We're open 5 days a week at The OHRA Center. Navigators assist with a myriad of services, like preventing eviction, getting a job, finding shelter, accessing health care, getting ID, picking up mail. Resource navigators make our programs effective. They are skilled in helping each person find a path to stability.

Over the course of the year, we served **1,626 individuals** through multiple encounters resulting in **14,133 total visits** – on average **54 per day**. At the Resource Center, **OHRA helped 95 unhoused people get permanently housed** and prevented another **88 people from eviction and homelessness**.

Emergency Shelter

The OHRA Center Shelter is a fully-staffed, low-barrier shelter operating 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. We offer temporary shelter to the most at-risk individuals.

OHRA's Shelter can be a springboard to permanent housing. Guests meet regularly with resource navigators who help them on their path to stability.



In FY 2023 we moved **28 unhoused people from our 52-room shelter into permanent housing**.



Laundry/Shower Trailer

Over the course of the year, OHRA was able to provide **1,580 showers** and wash **521 loads of laundry**.

OHRA's Laundry/Shower Trailer fills an essential need for people who are unhoused.

The Laundry/Shower Trailer offers unhoused neighbors comfort and dignity. **Resource navigators who can assist guests with other services are always present during operating hours**. Generous volunteers from Laundry Love make our laundry services possible, thank you!

La Clinica at The OHRA Center

In partnership with La Clinica, the OHRA Wellness Center opened in 2023. It is located at The OHRA Center and is staffed by La Clinica. **This federally qualified health center serves guests of the OHRA Shelter and Resource Center**, offering primary care and mental health services.
